RESOLUTION #3 21/22

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, OSCEOLA COUNTY, IOWA

Supervisor Schulte read the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors is empowered under authority of Section 306.41 of the Code of lowa to temporarily close sections of road by formal resolution when they deem necessary for construction, maintenance, or natural disaster,

AND WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors, County of Osceola, have determined that the following section of road should be temporarily closed due to road construction:

Sanitary Sewer Line to New Kwik Trip Site

Local Road Pierce between 170 St. and 180 St.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the above described roads be closed temporarily in the manner described below.

"ROAD CLOSED" signs shall be placed on both ends of the described segment of road, and they shall remain in place until the construction is completed.

Supervisor Helmers seconded the motion to adopt said Resolution # 3 21/22. Ayes: Schulte, Helmers, DeBoer, Jones. Nay- VandeHoef.

I hereby certify that the above and foregoing Resolution was duly and legally adopted at a legal meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Osceola County, Iowa, and properly journalized in the minutes thereof on the 17th day of August, 2021.

The train derailment sight was discussed. Dan Bechler, EMA Director, informed the Board that there is 40,000 gallons of hazardous materials still at the sight. He has been called out there four times. He has been in contact with the railroad company hazmat and was told yesterday that they will come and get it and dispose of it. Complaints have been heard in regard to the weeds around the sight. Nick Schmalen, Weed Commissioner, will send a letter to the railroad company asking that the weeds be taken care of there. The Board asked County Attorney Nolan McGowan, to see what options we have to resolve this situation and report back to the Board on next Tuesday, August 24th.
