Notice is hereby given to the eligible electors of Osceola County, Iowa that there will be a **PRIMARY ELECTION** in Osceola County, Iowa, at the regular polling place in each of the eight (8) voting precincts of said county on

TUESDAY, JUNE 7, 2022

The polls will open at all voting precincts as listed below at 7 a.m. and will close at 8:00 p.m. as provided by law.

ASHTON PRECINCT: City of Ashton, Gilman Township and West ½ of Goewey Township - **Ashton Legion Community Building-321 3rd St., Ashton, IA**

HARRIS PRECINCT: City of Harris, Fairview Township and Sections 1-12 of Allison Township – **Harris Civic Center 122 Main St. S, Harris, IA**

MAY CITY PRECINCT: Sections 13-36 of Allison Township and Sections 1-18, 22-27, and 34-36 of Harrison Township - **May City Fire Station- 6656 Frederick Ave., May City, IA**

MELVIN PRECINCT: City of Melvin, East ½ of Goewey Township, Baker Township, and Sections 19-21 and 28-33 of Harrison Township – **Melvin Legion Hall – 225 Main St., Melvin, IA**

OSCEOLA 3 PRECINCT: Commencing at the Intersection on 100th Street and McKinley Avenue, thence South to 170th Street, thence East on 170th Street, continuing on 5th Street, thence Northerly on the corporate limits, thence East on 4th Street, thence North on 4th Avenue, thence East on 2nd Street, thence South on 6th Avenue, thence East on 3rd Street, thence South on 8th Avenue, thence East on 4th Street, thence South on 9th Avenue, thence East on 5th Street and continuing East on 170th Street, thence North on Pierce Avenue, thence Northeasterly on Northwest Blvd., thence West on 140th Street, thence North on Pierce Avenue, thence West on 120th Street, thence North on Oriole Avenue, thence West on 100th Street to the point of beginning at McKinley Avenue. **United Methodist Church – 700 11th Ave NE, Sibley, IA**

Iowa law states that in order to vote in the Primary Election, you must choose either the Democratic or Republican Ballot (Section 43.38, Iowa Code). You may declare or change your party affiliation at the polls on Election Day according to Section 43.42, Iowa Code, by noting that change when you sign the election register provided by the Precinct Election Officials.

This notice is published in compliance with §49.53-Code of Iowa.

Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day- and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove

residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the County Auditor's office by 12:00 noon on Monday, June 13, 2022. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification.
