## GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Gates: 7:00 A.M. - 9:00 P.M.
2. All diligence will be used to insure the safety of the livestock and other exhibits after their arrival. The Osceola County Fair Board employs policemen to guard exhibits on the grounds. No liability will be assumed by the Fair Association, in the case of breakage or vandalism.
3. All premium holders who have claims to be adjusted must make complaints within 15 days following the close of the fair or forfeit that right. No premiums will be changed after that date.
4. The sale or drinking of intoxicating liquors will be absolutely prohibited on the fair grounds. No gambling device or privilege of questionable or demoralizing character will be permitted.
5. **All Open Class and Commercial exhibits will be released between 9:00 and 11:00 P.M. on Saturday, July 22.**
6. The Open Class and Commercial buildings will open at 11:00 A.M. each day and will close at 8:00 P.M. Wednesday - Friday.

### OPEN CLASS DEPARTMENTS RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Open class entries are open to anyone who wishes to exhibit at the Osceola County Fair. Entrants are not limited to residents of Osceola County.
2. All articles must be the work of one who does not teach or sell these products for a livelihood in their home, shop or store. Entries from professionals will not be accepted. **Please be mindful of Copyrighted/Trademark laws.**
3. **ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED FROM 5 P.M. UNTIL 7P.M. ON TUESDAY, JULY 18, AND 8 A.M. UNTIL 12:00, NOON WEDNESDAY, JUL 19. RELEASE TIME IS 9:00 -11:00 A.M. ON SATURDAY JULY 22. All exhibits MUST be removed at this time.** Premiums will not be paid on exhibits that are removed from the grounds before release time, unless the removal has the consent of the department superintendent and/or the fair secretary.
4. A \$1.00 entry fee, to be paid in the secretary's office, entitles the exhibitor to enter in all departments. All entry fees are part of the total prize money.
5. **Every entry or article must be the work of the exhibitor in all age categories** and must have been made, canned or grown since last year's fair, unless otherwise stated. Articles that have been shown or judged in Osceola County previously cannot be entered.
6. Soiled or unfinished work will not be accepted or entered for premiums.
7. Exhibitors will not be allowed in the display cases.
8. An insult to the judges will subject the party making it, subject to expulsion from the grounds and forfeiture of premiums. Superintendents will take special care to instruct all committees under their supervision on the importance and faithful observance of this rule.
9. The following rule has been unanimously adopted by the Fair Managers Association: Where there is but one exhibit in a class, only one premium may be awarded. "Where there are only two exhibits in a class, two premiums may be awarded. Where there are three or more exhibits in a class all premiums may be awarded."
10. Open class entries will be given a ribbon placing in each

class. A ribbon placing may not be given if the judge feels the exhibit is not worthy of a placing and/or ribbon.

11. Exhibitors must not change their exhibits, or any part thereof, after the hour for the exhibit to be in place. A violation of this rule will result in the forfeiture of any and all premiums won in this department.

12. **\*\*\*Junior Exhibitors must be present at time of entry.\*\*\*\***

**A "BEST OF SHOW" rosette will be awarded to the exhibitor in each Department and/or Division, as selected by the judge, to be considered an outstanding exhibit. There is no premium money for these awards.**

of old corn which show any indication of not having been produced during the previous year. The same sample of corn cannot be exhibited in more than one class.

2. Entries in these classes will be limited to one sample in each class from the same farm or individual.
3. All entries in this department must be raised or grown by the person exhibiting it.
4. All sheaves must be 3 inches in diameter at the center band, except Timothy.
5. No ear of corn in any sample may have more than one percent of its grain missing. All samples must be in their natural condition at both butts and tips of the ears.
6. New corn must be at least in the dent stage.
7. Exhibitors must not change their exhibit, or any part thereof, after the hour designated for the exhibit to be in place. A violation of this rule will mean the forfeiture of any and all premiums won by the exhibitor in this department.

#### VEGETABLE PREPARATION:

**Asparagus:** Uniform length of 7"-8"

**Beans:** Leave 1/4"-1/2" stem on pod.

**Beets, Carrots, Parsnips:** Tops should be trimmed to 1 1/2" above the top. Leave tap root. Small to medium size preferred. Free from sunburn. Do not wash.

**Broccoli:** Wash and keep refrigerated until ready to exhibit. Heads should be firm, uniform in color and in tight bud stage.

**Brussels Sprouts:** Two or three outer leaves should be left on.

**Cabbage:** Heads should be solid. Two or three outer leaves should be left on. Trim stem close to head.

**Cauliflower:** Trim "Jacket" leaves even with top of head. Leave 1/2" stem below leaves.

**Celery:** Crisp, firm stalks with uniform color. Trim leaves uniformly and remove roots. Wash and refrigerate until ready to exhibit.

**Corn:** Remove husk from one side of ear. Trim silk to within 1" of top of husk. Trim shank to bottom of ear.

**Cucumbers:** Smooth, straight and uniform in color. Leave 1/2" stem.

**Eggplant:** Do not wash. Wipe with soft cloth. Leave 1" stem.

**Garlic:** Leave 1" stem and trim roots to 1/4". Brush off soil. Do not wash. Do not remove sheath.

**Herbs:** Rinse in cold water.

**Kale:** Dark green crisp leaves. Remove discolored outer leaves. Place roots in a jar of water.

**Kohlrabi:** Cut leaves to 1"-2" in length. Trim roots to 1"-2" below ball.

**Onions dry:** Do not remove outer scales. Do not wash. Trim tops to 1". Trim roots to 1/4".

**Onions, green:** Remove loose skin. Cut tops to 4"-5" above white shank. Trim roots to 1/2".

**Peas:** Pick with stem attached.

**Peppers:** Leave 1/2"-1" stem attached

**Potatoes:** Tubers should be free of disease, insect and mechanical damage. Defects such as knobs, cracks and green color are undesirable. Tubers should be typical of the variety. Any weight from 6-12 Ounces is considered desirable, but all potatoes in the exhibit should be as nearly uniform in size and shape as possible. Potatoes should be clean but not scrubbed.

**Pumpkins, Winter Squash:** Mature fruit, leave a 2" stem attached.

**Radishes:** Remove injured leaves and tie in a bunch.

**Rhubarb:** Pull, don't cut stalks. Trim leaves so 1" leaf blade remains.

**Rutabagas:** Larger sizes are generally most desirable. They should be sweet, clean, bright in color, and free of side roots and blemishes.

**Spinach:** Pull entire plant, trim off roots to crown.

**Squash - Summer:** Leave 1"-2" stem attached.

**Tomatoes:** Uniform in size and color. Remove stems

**Turnips:** Leave 1"-2" of tops and at least 2" of tap root. Do not scrub. Best size is 2"-3" in diameter. Smooth skin, firm flesh and uniform in color.

6. All entries submitted for showing and judging must be homemade. No individual or any member of the group of the submitted entry shall be involved with commercial wine or beer making. Any wine or beer that may be legally sold is not considered eligible.
7. Wines must be bottled in standard wine bottles, at least 16 ounces. Beer must be bottled in 12 ounce or larger bottles with all labels removed and all bottles should be securely capped or corked. No decanters will be accepted.
8. Wine will be judged on taste/texture, appearance, aroma/ bouquet, aftertaste and overall impression. Beer will be judged on taste, aroma, and appearance.
9. All entries will be stored at room temperature until prior to the competition when the beer will be chilled to proper serving temperature. Wines will be judged at room temperature.
